SECTION- I

Puthimari College : A Brief Profile

Puthimari College, a premier institution of higher education in Puthimari area was established on August 5, 1981. The establishment of the college is the outcome of the effort vanguard people of the area because the people felt that the people of the greater Puthimari area had been deprived of access to higher education owing to the absence of higher educational institution in the locality. Thanks to the initiative taken by the enthusiastic people of the area, for setting up of the college by the bank of river Puthimari that comes forward to fulfill the long-felt thirst for higher education for the young generation. Presently, the academic activities of the institution widen beyond the territory of the district. It is now acknowledged as one of the pioneers of higher education in Assam. Meanwhile, the College has attained “B” grade in NAAC Re-accreditation in 2012.

The college stands at Soneswar by the Puthimari River in the district of Kamrup(R). It is 40 kms to the north of Guwahati, the capital of Assam. 31 No. National Highway connects the college by a PWD road at Baihata. It is situated in a sylvan area with the Puthimari River in the west and Alta village in the east.

The college has enough provisions for class rooms, departments, well equipped library and student union hall etc. The college has also sufficient provisions for games and sports for the students and several committees to cater to the needs for all round development of the students as well as the community. It is now it has set up a digital classroom and e-learning room to facilitate the students with the taste of knowledge world wide. Hostel facility for girl students are being made available. The college is likely to open new streams like science, commerce as well as vocational courses.

SECTION- III

A Summary of the GU UG-CBCS

What is UG-CBCS ?

The undergraduate degree (UG) programme in the **Choice Based Credit System** (CBCS) will have course spread across six-semester of any undergraduate degree course. Two consecutive (one odd and one even) semesters will make up an academic year. An UG course shall be of Six Semesters covering three Calendar Years (Academic Sessions- June to May). The duration of the **Odd** Semesters (First, Third, and Fifth) shall be **June-November**, and that of **Even** Semesters (Second, Fourth and Sixth) shall be **December-May**. No wear due to present situation of covid-19 the duration of semester may changed by the G.U. which will be not bed in due course.



How does it work ?

The courses in GU UG-CBCS are categorised primarily into three types of courses - Core, Elective, and Ability/Skill Enhancement courses. All the core and elective courses will comprise of six (6) credits and the skill courses are of four (4) credits.

Core Course :

As the name suggests, a core course is a necessary course that a student **MUST** take in order to complete the degree. The number of core courses for Honours and Regular degrees are different.

Elective Course :

An elective course is the one for which a student has some kind of freedom to choose from a pool of courses. There are two kinds of elective courses - Generic and Discipline Specific. The generic elective courses are those, which can be chosen by a student belonging to any stream, while the discipline specific elective courses are particular to only the discipline concerned. However, a student pursuing an honours degree course can choose a generic elective from any other discipline except from the honours course itself.

Ability / Skill Enhancement Course :

An ability or Skill Enhancement course is aimed at providing the student with skill and ability. These courses have four (4) credits each in contrast to the core or elective courses. The ability enhancement courses **MUST** be opted by a student and the student can choose papers from a pool of skill enhancement courses.

Dissertation / Project :

A student can opt (subject to conditions) a dissertation or a project work in lieu of a 6-credit discipline specific elective course in the sixth semester.

The Notion of Credit :

A student needs to earn a required number of **credits** in order to successfully complete a degree. The credit is closely related to the number of stipulated classes a student has to complete. The following table indicates the number of credit a student can earn for type of indicated classes.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE (ONLINE)

1. Online application form and Prospectus are available in college portal. For further information application, eligibility and admission details visit www.puthimaricollege.in

2. Online application form shall be made available from 13.06.2020.

- ❖ Students will be selected for admission strictly on merit.
- ❖ The College follows the government rules of reservation for admission of the students belonging to SC/ST/OBC/MOBC.
- ❖ A few seats are also reserved for physically handicapped students and for the students having outstanding achievements in sports, cultural field and NCC.
- ❖ Others documents must be submitted as directed in the application form.

➡ **Free Studentship:**

Free studentship will be offered as per the Assam Government prescribed guideline.

■ **Renewal of Admission:**

a) Students are required renew their admission in H.S. 2nd Year, B.A. 3rd Semester and B.A. 5th Semester within June every year. (The stipulated date will be announced by the Principal)

b) Students are required to renew their identity card in H.S. 2nd Year, B.A. 3rd Semester and B.A. 5th Semester within June every year.

➡ **Document in origin to be produced at the time of counselling and admission.**

- (a) Marksheet of the last qualifying examination.
- (b) Transfer certificate from the Head of the institution last attended.
- (c) Caste certificate in case of OBC, MOBC, SC, and ST applicants.
- (d) Students passing the qualifying examination earlier than the current year will have to submit a gap certificate from the head of the institution last attended.
- (e) One copy of passport size (not attested) photograph for identity card.



SECTION- V

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE OF STUDENTS

- a. A minimum attendance of 75% is compulsory for a student to appear in Council and University Examinations as per instruction.
Students must have at least 75% attendance (attending direct instruction hours) to maintain the credit. In case a student fails to have at least 75% attendance, he/she will not be allowed to sit for the end semester examination and have to repeat the concerned semester after the successful completion of the subsequent semester.
- b. Passing marks for different papers are as follows-
Theory Paper – 30% Practical Paper – 40% Simple Pass – 30% to 39% (CGPA 4 to 5)
Honours – 40% (CGPA above 5)
- c. Use of any intoxicating item such as ‘Gutkha’, and spitting, writing and sticking anything on the College walls are strictly prohibited. Anybody found guilty of violating the prohibition will be liable for disciplinary.
- d. Students are advised to collect their college identity card at the time of admission. Keeping identity card in the college campus is compulsory for them. The card must be renewed every year.
- e. All the students of the College are advised to come to College in prescribed College uniform. Violence of the same will subject them to strict disciplinary action.
- f. Students will not be allowed to use Mobile Phone within the college campus.

SECTION- VI

CURRICULAR, CO CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES AND STUDENTS' WELFARE SCHEME

➤ **Feedback Mechanism :**

There is a mechanism of feedback in which self evaluation is done centrally on the basis of well prepared questionnaire twice in a year. Each and every department conduct properly, after evaluation result analysis report is submitted to the principal.

➤ **Academic Management :**

I.Q.A.C. is responsible for academic management in the college. The I.Q.A.C. endeavours plans and take action for quality enhancement in the campus for creation of academic atmosphere.

College undertake various practices for teacher student contact and for development of students in extra curricular activities as well as the academic enhancement.

➤ **Students Empowerment :**

The college accords various strategies for students empowerment. Students are allowed to form an union in a democratic way and also as per the guidelines of supreme court to take part in decesion making process. There are various committees such. Grievance and Redressal Cell, Disciplinary cell and Skill development cell for the students.

➤ **Student Research Project :**

Each and every dept. conduct research project. As a part of the course specially honours students are required to submit the research project.

➤ **Research Journal :**

The research journal named “concept” publish every year to ensure quality research for utmost development of the learner.

➤ **Future Plan :**

The College has planned to open up streams of Science, Commerce, Vocational courses and other diploma courses in the college. Adequate steps have been taken in this regard. It has also planned to provide required infrastructure for sports and to grow it as an ICT hub.

➤ **Activities for Physical and mental fitness**

The College provides facilities which are commonly necessary for physical and mental fitness of the student. Games and sports activities are regularly performed under the guideship of a teacher- in-charge against each category of activities – physical as well as mental. The college holds weeklong programme of games, sports, literary, talent search and cultural competitions to select the efficient students in each category. The college playground is the place for the important matches like football, volley ball, badminton, athletic competition. Competitions of indoor games and literacy and cultural events are also held annually. The proficient one from any event gets chance to join in university level or state level competitions. Apart from this, Yoga day is also observed to promte health care of the students.



➔ **Book Bank facility**

The college has **book bank facility**. The book bank lends books to the meritorious students with poor financial background. Students willing to avail themselves of this opportunity should apply to the librarian in prescribed form.

➔ **Scholarship**

The College distributes national, state merit, minority community and SC/ST/OBC/MOBC Scholarship as per the rules laid down by the government.

➔ **Awards**

For the Academic encouragement of the students, two cash awards are offered annually by the College authority to the Best Graduate and the Best H.S. Scholar respectively.

Another award is offered by Dr. A. D. Baruah to the H.S. Scholar/scholars securing highest marks in Assamese (MIL) in the latest H.S. Examination.

N.B.:- A minimum of 60% marks in the subject has to be obtained in order to qualify for these awards.

➔ **Students' Aid Fund**

The college provides financial assistance to the students hailing from poor economic background. Eligible students shall have to apply to the Principal stating his/her economic background alongwith a certificate from Gaonburah or Mauzadar of the locality and a photocopy of the ration card of the family.

➔ **Internet & Printing Facility**

Internet and printing facility is available in the College free of cost for the College family as urgency demands.

➔ **Boys' and Girls' Common Room**

There are separate Common rooms for boys and girls. The students may avail recreational facilities with the available indoor and outdoor equipments.

➔ **Publication**

The student community publishes an annual magazine "Puthimarian" by which they can focus on their efficiency in creativity. Moreover, some of the departments publish departmental magazines which can help the student to publish their important writings.

EXTENSION SERVICES & SOCITIES

Following the guidelines of the UGC and in pursuit of the mission of the college as an institute of higher education, it has formed certain cells/socities which are serving for the promotion of other important dimensions of higher education i.e extension of education, research, counselling.



➔ **IQAC**

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Puthimari College, was established on January 03, 2005 in order to ensure quality education in the institution. Since quality enhancement is a continuous process of any institution, the IQAC is expected to be a part of the system and work of the college towards the realisation of the goals of quality enhancement and sustenance. To develop a system for a conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the overall performance of the institution is the first and foremost concern of the cell. With a view to developing a sense of belongingness and participation among all concerned, the IQAC will work to take up the first step to internalize and institutionalize the quality enhancement initiatives. Thus the cell is expected to make the institution fit to survive with glory in the world of education, ringed with cut-throat competition.

➔ **WOMEN'S CELL**

The Women's Cell of the college addresses the problematic issues related to woman and it aims at development, uplift and enlightenment of the female community of the greater region. The cell has already organised talks and interactive session on woman empowerment, woman and law, Domestic Violence Act etc. and performed a street play with the students to create awareness to this effect. The cell observes International Woman's Day every year on 8th March.

➔ **NSS & NCC SENIOR DIVISION**

Regular activities are performed by N.S.S. and NCC Senior Division volunteers within the and outside the campus. For the greater interest of the community, the unit adopts a village every year for their overall welfare, and special camp is organized by the unit for one week. The camping and regular activities are meant to inculcate the spirit of voluntary work among the students and teachers. It brings our academic institutions closer to society. It also helps to combine knowledge and action for the desirable community development.

Puthimari College has an active NCC wing under 30 Assam ENGR Coy with a capacity of fifty cadets. The wing has been active since October, 2017. The cadets have been actively taking part in regular classes and all other social service based activities and camps. The cadets of the college have so far completed four camps. The first camp from 14th September to 18th September, 2018 at Army Engineer Attachment Camp, Changsari; the second camp from 5th October to 14th October, 2018 at Umroi, Meghalaya; the third and the fourth camp at Rajiv Gandhi Indoor Stadium, Amingaon from 2nd January to 11th January, 2019 and from 31st January to 2nd February, 2019 respectively.



➤ **Extension Education Centre**

There is an Extension Education Centre in the college for launching extension works. The works are meant to substantiate the true values of education in practical lives of the students to learn by doing. The objective of the centre is also meant to establish social link to the college as well as to uplift the society. This year the centre is going to adopt Azara village from June, 2016 onwards. For this work the Extension Education Centre of the college has no financial source except a amount that to be released from the college fund.

➤ **Information and Career Guidance Cell**

Students can avail themselves of the facility of Information and Career Guidance cell of the College. They can have proper counselling from the cell headed by a professor of the college.

➤ **STUDENTS' UNION**

The college has to look after a democratically elected Students' Union the affairs of students in academic and cultural fields. Election is held in as per academic calender in every year. Authority makes arrangement for free and fair election in the college campus as per constitution adopted by union. A minimum attendance of 75% is compulsory for a student to contest in the election of Students' Union.
